




English:

In KS3, students have been reading a range of short stories by the writer Anthony Horowitz. We have been looking at ways that a writer can start a story, develop the plot and end it effectively. The students have written an ending for a story that they have started: 'The killer camera'- Matthew, a young boy, has bought a camera from a strange man at a car boot sale. But every time the camera takes a photo, ghastly things happen...

This term, KS4 students have been working on GCSE skills— creative writing, and speaking and listening. Humanities:

Students in key stage 3 and 4 have completed some fantastic work in humanities. They started the year studying coastal environments. Understanding waves, coastal features and processes have been looked at in detail. Students have both modelled and sketched arches and stacks, which can be seen below...

A huge well done to the year 11 students who have completed an AQA Unit Award showing a good understanding of erosion and depositional features along the coastline.

More recently, we have moved onto a study of World War 2. students have completed work on several key points in the war, including Dunkirk, evacuation, The Blitz, Pearl Harbor and the D-Day landings. 13 students have recently completed an AQQ Unit Award on the Spitfire.

GCSE Geography:

Our GCSE students have also been studying the physical environment this term by looking at both coasts and rivers.

Understanding the processes that cause our coastline and rivers to change over time, including what causes flooding, has been studied.





Art:

The students in key stage 3 have learnt about Pop Art and graffiti Art this term. Through the Pop Art unit, the students were introduced to a number of pop artists from the past and they have had the opportunity to complete their own individual pieces of this type of art. They have certainly brightened up the art room with their fantastic, colorful artwork!



The students have also discovered what graffiti and street art is. They have enjoyed designing their own 'tags' and completing pieces of graffiti in the style of famous artists, such as Banksy, Haring and Hayuk. They also demonstrated great listening and speaking skills to debate whether graffiti is a form of vandalism or art.

Through this magical and exciting unit, the students in key stage 4 discovered what optical illusions are, and how artists create them. They had a number of opportunities to create their own pieces of optical illusion art. They have also learnt a number of oil pastel techniques. Sgraffito being the firm favourite with most students! They have used a variety of these oil pastel techniques to complete impressive, larger pieces of work

Operation Christmas Child:

Operation Christmas Child is a hands on way to support children all across the world by filling shoeboxes with toys, personal care items, school supplies and fun gifts. We collected new and nearly new items for different age categories for the children's shoe boxes. On the morning of the event, they set up the rooms, decorated them and ensured that everyone knew what they were doing. Sixth formers ran the event beautifully and had chance to build upon their communication and team working skills. They interacted well with other students and ensured that everyone got involved. We invited parents and carers in during the afternoon to join in with our charity event and see how hard the students had worked. It was so lovely to see so many of our parents and carers supporting our sixth formers and the school for the first event of the school year. It was also fantastic to see some of our sixth formers push themselves outside of their comfort zones to interact with people that they haven't seen before and develop some key transferable skills. We managed to raise over £150 for Macmillan Cancer Research, which is the most we have raised to date.
